Bone cancer symptoms

Possible symptoms of bone cancer include:

- **Bone pain:** Pain is the most common sign of bone cancer, and may become more noticeable as the tumor grows. Bone pain can cause a dull or deep ache in a bone or bone region (e.g., back, pelvis, legs, ribs, arms). Early on, the pain may only occur at night, or when you are active. As the cancer develops, though, the pain may become more persistent. Other conditions, like osteoporosis or arthritis, may also cause bone or joint pain.
 - **Swelling:** The area where the pain is localized may begin to show signs of swelling, or a lump or mass may be present.
 - **Fractures:** Cancerous cells can weaken the bone, and this may sometimes result in a fracture. The break may occur in an area of the bone that had previously been sore or painful for a period of time.
 - **Decreased mobility:** In some cases, if the location of the tumor is near a joint, it may make normal movements difficult or painful.
- Other symptoms:** Unintended weight loss and fatigue that accompanies bone pain may be a sign of bone cancer. Other symptoms, such as difficulty breathing, may develop if the cancer has spread to other organs.

A Message from the Pastor

The Importance of Walking

When you read the Bible, you see that God has been big on walking from the start. After Adam and Eve disobeyed Him, they heard “the sound of the Lord God as he was walking in the Garden in the cool of the day” **Genesis 3:8**. When they hid from God, He called to them. And soon after that, God sacrificed an animal to provide skins as a covering for their nakedness. It is the first record in Scripture of a blood sacrifice being used to address the sins of humanity. The more we read in the Bible about walking, the more we realize that it’s best done with someone else. It’s not easy to walk alone. It’s not even easy to stand alone. The writer of **Ecclesiastes** points out that “if one falls down, his friend can help him up. But pity the man who falls and has no one to help him up!” **(4:10)**. When Jesus went to the garden of Gethsemane to pray on the night of His betrayal and arrest, He begged His closest friends to keep watch with Him. He knew He would soon be walking into the most painful ordeal anyone has faced, and He didn’t want to walk there alone. Sadly, His disciples failed Him and fell asleep. God however, is a faithful Walking Companion. It’s no accident that scripture often characterizes the life of faith as a life of “walking with God”.

Isaiah 53:5-12 Good News Translation (GNT)

⁵ But because of our sins he was wounded, beaten because of the evil we did. We are healed by the punishment he suffered, made whole by the blows he received. ⁶ All of us were like sheep that were lost, each of us going his own way. But the LORD made the punishment fall on him, the punishment all of us deserved. ⁷ "He was treated harshly, but endured it humbly; he never said a word. Like a lamb about to be slaughtered, like a sheep about to be sheared, he never said a word. ⁸ He was arrested and sentenced and led off to die, and no one cared about his fate. He was put to death for the sins of our people. ⁹ He was placed in a grave with those who are evil, he was buried with the rich, even though he had never committed a crime or ever told a lie." ¹⁰ The LORD says, "It was my will that he should suffer; his death was a sacrifice to bring forgiveness. And so he will see his descendants; he will live a long life, and through him my purpose will succeed. ¹¹ After a life of suffering, he will again have joy; he will know that he did not suffer in vain. My devoted servant, with whom I am pleased, will bear the punishment of many and for his sake I will forgive them. ¹² And so I will give him a place of honor, a place among the great and powerful. He willingly gave his life and shared the fate of evil men. He took the place of many sinners and prayed that they might be forgiven."
